


What a great start to Term 4!





We were very excited to be able to go to the Halloween Disco at school. It was great to relax and have some fun with everyone!














This term we have been busy writing information reports using Seven Steps Techniques to make them more interesting. We have been learning lots of interesting facts about animals.

Room 4 Miss Condon




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Thirarndi 4 are currently doing a novel study on Nim's Island. So far we have discussed and answered big questions such as 'Why was Nim left alone of the island?', learnt new vocabulary and facts about sea turtles. There are also opportunities for students to practise writing skills such as creating summary sentences and sentence expansion.



Information Reports are our writing text type for this term. We have learnt so many fascinating facts about animals like octopi and crocodiles. Did you know that a crocodile can't stick out its tongue? These facts have helped students to writing Sizzling Starts using techniques such as starting with a question or painting a word picture for their audience.






Fractions, fractions and more fractions! We have done so much work around the topic of fractions. Students have been converting improper fractions to mixed fractions, putting fractions on number lines, comparing fractions and even identifying equivalent (same value) fractions. Thirarndi 4 have also been learning to identify and compare angles such as Right Angles, Acute Angles and Obtuse Angles. Their ability to measure angles using a protractor is also improving.



Special Visitors

Thirarndi 4 had some special visitors this term! We learnt about bush fires in HASS so the Geraldton Firefighters gave us a visit to teach us about house fires. They had so much information on how to prevent and respond to a house fire. The Firefighters even put on a fake rescue to show the class how they would rescue people from an emergency and how their safety gear worked.

Science Mrs Agnew

Biological Sciences is our focus for Term Four. The junior primary students have been looking at the external features of animals. We went on a school yard safari and found lots of little critters! We also used our magnifying glasses to take a close look at earthworms. Then we made a worm habitat for our new friends!





Our senior students are learning about the structural and behavioural adaptations of plants and animals which allow them to survive in their environments. We considered the kangaroo and how it can survive the harsh, dry conditions of desert and semi-arid areas. We then took a close look at a variety of leaves and the way they have adapted to areas of high or low rainfall and/or sunlight. Nature is amazing!







The middle primary students are looking at the observable features of living things and how they can be grouped together. We went outside to record living things, non-living things and once-living things. We also learned that a seed is alive, just waiting for the right conditions to get growing!
