










They are reviewing previously learnt sounds and blending to read CVC words. Please continue to practise this at home.




Our potatoes are still growing strong. We have been watering them every week and cannot wait to dig them up.




Room 4 Miss Condon

Hello and welcome back to Term 3. It has been wonderful seeing so many students returning to school ready to learn and excited for the term ahead.




Literacy




